

**MINUTES
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Thursday, May 31, 2001

The Orland City Mayor, State of California, called a duly noticed Special Joint Concurrent Meeting of the Glenn County Board of Supervisors, Orland City Council, and the Willows City Council to order at 6:33 p.m., at Kountry Kitchen, 729 4th Street, Orland, CA 95963, with members as follows:

1. The Mayor called for additional items to be placed on agenda, with none to be added.
2. **Miscellaneous**
Matter: Discussion on various matters set forth on the agenda.
Proceedings: Councilpersons and Supervisors discussed the following issues, with no action taken:
 - a. Energy Crisis, Regional Council of Rural Counties Video Presentation by Dr. Lon House, Energy Consultant
Supervisor Bungarz submitted handout *The California Summer of 2001: Get Ready* and above video was viewed; Supervisor Freeman advised that 1,000 hours of blackouts in California this summer would amount to three or four days for Glenn County, discussed reasons for the shortage, and advised that PG&E has a list of those on life support to notify before a blackout so that they may prepare; Sheriff Bob Shadley advised that they are prepared for blackout emergencies, and that PG&E notifies them for Stage 2 and Stage 3 alerts, whereby he notifies certain agencies and that at Stage 3 he brings in a second dispatch officer and third deputy to cover the area affected. Supervisor Bungarz advised of the website www.caiso.com which tracks predicted and actual power usage.
 - b. Glenn County Gang Prevention Initiative
 - (1) Brandon Thompson, Supervising Probation Officer, submitted various Probation worksheets and *Project Exit Connecting Youth to Their Community*, gave a brief history of Probation, advised that there are 7 million people on probation nationally, and approximately 900 adult probationers, 90 juveniles on formal probation and 65 juveniles on informal probation in Glenn County, advised that the focus of the Department is to get out in the community to see probationers in their environment so to keep better track of their activities; also advised that Juvenile Hall is being expanded from a 8 to a 22 bed facility, and that Drug Court is moving forward towards a Juvenile Drug Court.
 - (2) Rick Beatty, Deputy Probation Officer II, advised that most juveniles are referred by law enforcement to probation for rehabilitation whereas adults are referred to the District Attorney, and that there are many programs for the juveniles, a few being the Diversion Program, Out of Home Placement, Juvenile Court Work Program, Drug and Alcohol Counseling, Youth Employment Services; advised that the serious offenders are

- sent to the California Youth Authority which costs approximately \$36,000 per year per juvenile.
- (3) Danny Munguia, Project Coordinator of the Project Exito, Probation Department, distributed business cards and advised that he is not a Probation Officer or affiliated with law enforcement, that the grant sponsoring the program focused on 16 to 18 year olds, although in the future they need to begin at age 12, that 40 to 45 kids will be in the program, and that an Intervention team which includes law enforcement, the schools, Human Resource Agency, Health Services Agency, and Probation meets bi-weekly; advised and asked for community service ideas, plans to have open gyms in each High School once a week over the summer, and other fun events planned as the kids earn the privilege.
- c. State Budget Impact on Local Government
Supervisor Freeman advised that the State Budget process began this date, and will continue for six weeks until the Budget is settled, advised that several local programs are at risk whereby the League of Cities will advise the Cities and California State Association of Counties (CSAC) will advise the Counties as to budget information, that the State priorities are first energy, second education, that CSAC's theme is for the State not to balance their budget on local revenues; also asked that all local government officials call their legislators regarding local revenue cuts.
- d. Update on California Energy Commission, May 24 Load Reduction Exercise
Supervisor Bungarz advised that the County, Cities, and Special Districts participated in above exercise for 1½ hours, followed by the Federal Offices and then State Offices, and that he had seen no difference in use of energy on the www.caiso.com website and had not received the official results of the test; also advised that the Human Resource Agency, Hospital, and Jail went completely off line and used generators; Sheriff Bob Shadley advised that the jail bought shorts for their prisoners and raised the thermostat two degrees in the jail, with no complaints.
- e. Byron Denton, Orland citizen, requested that the Counties participate in funding the city parks, advised that many county citizens use the parks so it should be a shared expense; whereby Supervisor Bungarz asked if the city received any park bonds and Randy Johnson advised Orland received \$38,000.
3. Discussion was held regarding the scheduling of the next Joint meeting; whereupon it was decided that Willows would host the next meeting on August 16, 2001 at 6:00.
4. The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 8:16 p.m.
