## 1. Miscellaneous

**Matter:** Discussion on various matters set forth on the agenda.

**Proceedings:** Councilpersons and Supervisors discussed the following issues, with no action taken:

- a. Rezoning-General Plan-Farm Worker Housing - Supervisor Charles Harris spoke regarding migrant farm housing, and the need to have zoning for housing, that the General Plan needs to be amended with County and Cities, addressed needs of city sewers to be in place for housing, and upon further discussion it was decided that matter should be brought up in a regular Board meeting to discuss amending the general plan on this matter.
- b. Cellular/Pager Contract - Supervisor Denny Bungarz spoke regarding newly negotiated contract for cellular/pager and radio service with Nextel, and that contract is written so that if cities are interested they can also purchase new cellular phones on this contract, and advised that if interested to contact

Jody Samons with Cooperative Extension Service for further details.

c. Domestic Abuse Response Team (DART) County/Cities - Supervisor Denny Bungarz spoke regarding the domestic violence program, advising that the program costs \$65,000 a year to run, with Catalyst Women Advocates agreeing to fund \$40,000 for fiscal year 1999/2000, and also advising that there are eight volunteers in Orland, and four volunteers in Willows for program.

d. Flood Control - Supervisor Keith Hansen spoke regarding Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) cut backs on financial help with flooding, also that Colusa Basin Drainage District needs favorable letters from cities and counties to representatives in Sacramento supporting Colusa Basin project. Holly Whittaker representing Dick Dickerson spoke regarding \$3 million dollars promised for project in budget, Julie Lillywhite representing Doug Ose advised that no federal hearing on basin has been announced. Both cities agreed that a presentation to their Council would be appreciated for further understanding of Colusa Basin project.

e. Holly Whittaker, Representative for Dick Dickerson - Ms. Whittaker spoke regarding Assemblyman Dickerson working on budget and more local control by counties.

f. Tri-Counties Economic Development Corporation - Marc Nemanic spoke regarding a five year strategic plan for Tri-County Economic Development Corporation, and had a hand out for interested persons titled "Vision" which he reviewed.

g. Business Expansion Retention Program - Lora Ceccon of Public Works and Development Services Agency spoke advising of a seminar series for business owners on Business Expansion Retention Program Marketing.

h. American Property & Land Education Foundation, Inc. - Forrest Sprague spoke regarding the impact that Environmental Protection Agency has on politics, submitted and reviewed brochure "American Property and Land Education Foundation, Inc.", and spoke regarding property rights and his desire to help preserve rights for citizens.

i. Lori Pride requested a date be set for the next Joint Meeting, and upon discussion it was decided to hold the next meeting on August 26, 1999, with City of Orland as host.
