The Glenn Groundwater Authority JPA Agreement outlines election of Officers in Article 4.3 of the Agreement. The appointment of a Treasurer is outlined in Article 5.7.

4.3 Officers. The Board of Directors shall elect a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson, and a Secretary, and shall appoint a Treasurer as provided in Article 5.7. All officers will be elected by a supermajority of all Directors present as defined in Article 4.7. All officers will serve a one-year term extending from no earlier than July 1 of a given year and ending no later than June 30 of the following year. The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be Directors of the Board and the Secretary may, but need not

be a Director of the Board. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Board and the Vice-Chairperson shall act as the chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson elected by the Board.

5.7 Depositary and Treasurer. The Treasurer of the Authority shall be the County Treasurer, who shall be the depositary and have custody of all money of the Authority, from whatever source, subject to the applicable provisions of any indenture or resolution providing for a trustee or other fiscal agent. All funds of the Authority shall be held in separate accounts in the name of the Authority and not commingled with funds of any Member or any other person or entity. The Treasurer shall perform the duties specified in Government Code sections 6505 and 6505.5. Subject to the voting requirements in Articles 4.6 and 4.7, the Board may elect to appoint a different Treasurer, provided such appointment is subject to the requirements of Government Code sections 6505 and 6505.5.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Amaro called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m. and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

2. ROLL CALL

Roll call was taken as indicated above.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- Chairman Amaro invited comments or revisions on the aforementioned meeting minutes.

There was a motion by Director Schonauer, seconded by Director Roundy to approve the meeting minutes from July 10, 2023.

• Director Cavagnolo noted a revision needed in the July 10, 2023 minutes under Item 4, Period of Public Comment, to remove Chair Amaro's name and replace with Vice Chair Hansen.

Director Schonauer amended the motion to include the revision, Director Roundy agreed to second the motion with the noted revision. The motion passed unanimously.

4. PERIOD OF PUBLIC COMMENT

• Chair Amaro invited public comments; whereby, none were heard.

5. CLOSED SESSION

6. REPORT OUT FROM CLOSED SESSION

- Chair Amaro stated the Board received advice from Counsel regarding the Fee Study.

7. GSP IMPLEMENTATION FEE PROJECT

- a. Receive an update on the GGA Fee Project and timeline.
- b. *Consider Schedule for Long-Term Fee.
- Ms. Kincaid stated the Proposition 218 fee notice was sent out using an outdated address list resulting in an
 estimated 35% of incorrect addresses. In addition to some parcel related issues, she expressed concerns over
 the high percentage rate of error and how this could affect the statutory requirement which states, all parcels
 subject to the fee are to be notified within a 45-day period.
- Vice Chair Hansen asked if the listing was from the 2019 Proposition 218 process. Ms. Kincaid stated the
 current Assessor's list was compared with the 2019 list and it appears the 2019 Proposition 218 list was
 primarily relied upon for the mailing.
- Mr. Carmon stated concerns with moving forward with the fee as he feels the percentage of error is too high.
- Ms. Kincaid stated the GGA has at least another year under the existing Proposition 218 process. She stated
 options the Board has to consider, including moving forward with the new Proposition 218 process or
 rescinding the Proposition 218 notices, cancelling the public hearing and not seek to adopt a new 218. If the
 latter is selected, the GGA would rely on the existing Proposition 218, in which they would use the same
 process as previous years and adopt a Resolution setting the fee.
- Ms. Nicholls expressed concerns over the legalities of the existing fee as well as the new proposed fee and encouraged the Board to take additional time and propose a fee that can pass all of the legal requirements.

On motion by Director Gary Hansen seconded by Director Roundy, it was unanimously ordered to rescind the Proposition 218 notice for this year and not hold a Public Hearing on August 7, 2023 in reference to the Proposition 218 notice process.

No additional reports or comments were heard.

8. *CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE PROPOSAL FROM PROVOST & PRITCHARD CONSULTING GROUP TITLED ADDENDUM #4 TO CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT (CSA) NO. 18-344- CONSULTING SERVICES FOR TAX YEAR 2023-2024 DIRECT CHARGE PREPARATION, GLENN GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY, GLENN COUNTY, CALIFORNIA AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT PENDING LEGAL REVIEW

In order for the GGA property-related fee to be placed on the Glenn County Tax Roll for fiscal year 2023/2024, the direct charge file must be submitted to the Glenn County Department of Finance by August 10, 2023. In addition to the standard information for each entry, the file includes the parcel number and fee associated with the parcel. This list may change slightly from year to year for a variety of reasons, such as parcel splits.

Because Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group has the data files and mapping components that were used to compile the 2019 fee study and the 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 direct charge files, staff requested Provost & Pritchard to prepare a proposal to update the files for fiscal year 2023/2024. Staff believes contracting with Provost & Pritchard to complete this task will create the most consistent process and will be the most cost-efficient.

Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group has prepared the proposal in the form of an addendum to the original agreement to prepare the fee study in 2019. Addendums were executed for the preparation of the direct charge files in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

Staff recommends authorizing the Chairman to execute an agreement with Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group pending legal review in an amount not to exceed \$3,500.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit this addendum to provide consulting services for the subject project. This addendum discusses our understanding of the project, recommends a scope of services together with associated fees, deliverables and approximate schedules, sets forth our assumptions and discusses other services that may be of interest as the project proceeds.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

We understand that the Glenn Groundwater Authority (GGA) would like assistance in preparing the Direct Charge documents for the 2023-2024 Tax Year for Glenn County.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Our proposed scope of work for this addendum is described in one phase below.

PHASE T24: TAX YEAR 2023-24

- Complete parcel updates based on information provided by Glenn County Assessor and Department of Finance.
- Update calculations for parcels within GGA, based on guidance from GGA for current year charges.
- Assist in completing Direct Charge forms as required by the County.
- Submit final Direct Charge data file to County (Due Aug 10).

PROFESSIONAL FEES

Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group will perform the services for this Phase on a time and materials basis, in accordance with our Standard Fee Schedule in effect at the time services are rendered. For budgeting purposes, we estimate our fees to be \$2,500 to \$3,500 for the 2023-24 tax year effort, depending on the number of parcel updates required. These fees will be invoiced monthly as they are accrued. Reimbursable expenses will be invoiced in addition to professional fees and are included in the estimated range above. If it appears we will need to exceed the upper range above, we will notify you in writing before we do so and will \ppeng.com\pzdata\docs\Marketing\Proposals\2023\Glenn GW Authority - Direct Charge Submittals 23-24 23-421\Working Drafts\2023-0719 GGA Addendum TY 2023-2024 Direct Charge.docx

provide a revised estimate. We will not continue work beyond the initial budget without additional authorization.

SCHEDULE

Once we receive an executed copy of this addendum, and are authorized to proceed, we can request information/data from Glenn County regarding parcel changes and splits. The final data file and required documentation will be submitted by August 10, as legally required. Agency review time is beyond our control.

ASSUMPTIONS

- This proposal does not include updates to the ownership information associated with the parcels within the Glenn Groundwater Authority. Updates to parcel information is limited to merges/splits/assignment of new APNs.
- GGA shall forward the Direct Charge packet instructions from Glenn County to Provost & Pritchard, once made available.
- GGA will help coordinate the completion and submittal of Direct Charge forms required by Glenn County, including Counsel review.
- GGA is responsible for scheduling Board meetings to coincide with the submittal and/or approval of
 the Direct Charge documents by August 10. The fee estimate does not include meeting attendance
 by Provost & Pritchard, but staff can be available to do so for the same time and materials rate at the
 GGA's request.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

The following services are not included in this proposal, however these and others can be provided at additional cost, upon request.

 Updates of ownership information for the GGA jurisdiction, as provided by the Glenn County Assessor's office.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

9. GLENN GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY OPERATIONS FEE

- a. *Adopt the Glenn Groundwater Authority Operations Fee per acre for Fiscal Year 2023/2024.
- b. *Adopt Resolution 2023-003 Authorizing the County to Collect Property-Related Fees on the County Tax Roll and Indemnification of the Collecting Agency.
- c. *Authorize the Program Manger to complete or direct the completion of all tasks necessary for the completion of the submittal packet to the Glenn County Department of Finance.

On August 1, 2019, the Glenn Groundwater Authority Board adopted Resolution No. 2019-01 titled "Resolution Certifying the Results of a Proposition 218 Majority Protest Proceeding and Setting the Authority's Operations Fee". The maximum operations fee is set at \$1.93 per acre. The Board set the property-related fee at \$1.61 per acre for fiscal year 2019/2020 and \$1.50 per acre for the three subsequent fiscal years (2020/2021, 2021/2022, and 2022/2023).

Staff has prepared several options to consider in the figure below including the proposed fee from the 2019 fee report.

At the July 17, 2023 meeting, the Board approved the 2023/2024 Budget anticipating \$575,372 in revenue related to the operations fee. This resulted in a deficit budget of \$200,653.

In order for the adopted GGA property-related fee to be placed on the Glenn County Tax Roll for fiscal year 2023/2024, the direct charge packet must be submitted to the Glenn County Department of Finance by August 10, 2023. The instructions were received from the Glenn County Department of Finance and the submittal packet requirements are very similar to past submittals which required the direct charge file and a Prop 218 Certification Form/Direct Charge Submission Form.

During Item 8, the Board considered contracting with Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group for Tax Year 2023-2024 direct charge preparation.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY COLLECT PROPERTY-RELATED FEES ON THE 2023 TAX ROLL AND INDEMNIFICATION OF THE COLLECTING AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Glenn Groundwater Authority (the "Authority") requests the County of Glenn (the "County") to collect on the County tax rolls certain fees which the Authority has adopted pursuant to section 10730 of the California Water Code; and

WHEREAS, the County has required as a condition of the collection of said charges that the Authority warrant the legality of said fees and defend and indemnify the County from any challenge to the legality thereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Authority's Board of Directors that:

- 1. The Authority requests the Auditor-Controller of the County collect the property-related fees listed in Exhibit 1, attached hereto and incorporated herein, on the County tax rolls.
- 2. The Authority warrants and certifies the fees imposed by the Authority, which are requested to be collected by the County on the 2023/24 Secured Property Tax bill, comply with all requirements of state law, including but not limited to the requirements of Proposition 218 including Articles XIIIC and XIIID of the California Constitution.
- 3. The Authority agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, the Board of Supervisors, the Director of Finance, its officers, agents and employees (the "Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out whether the requirements of Proposition 218 and other state laws were met with respect to the imposition of fees by the Authority. The Authority agrees, in the event a judgment is entered in a court of law against any of the Indemnified Parties as a result of not meeting the requirements of any state law, including Proposition 218, for the collection of the Authority's fees, the County may offset the amount of the judgment paid by an Indemnified Party from any monies collected by County on behalf of Authority, including property taxes, fees, or assessments.
- 4. The Authority authorizes its agent to attest to the direct charge levies after verification and approval. The Authority agrees to the cost of direct charges and to the statutory and procedural terms for collection on the tax

roll.

10. GSP IMPLEMENTATION FEE PROJECT

At the December 19, 2022 meeting, the GGA Board approved an agreement with Luhdorff & Scalmanini Consulting Engineers (LSCE) to provide Groundwater Sustainability Agency data review, fee analysis and rate setting services (fee project).
