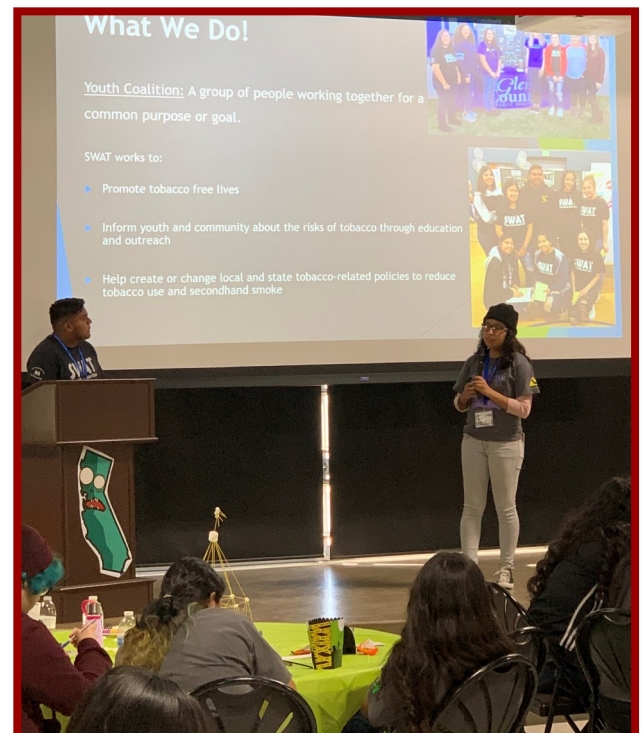
Left: Students participated in the "Shoe Swap" activity. This helps demonstrate how tobacco targets and effects different populations.

The Great American Smokeout (GAS) is an event that takes place on the third Thursday of every November where people are encouraged to quit using tobacco products.

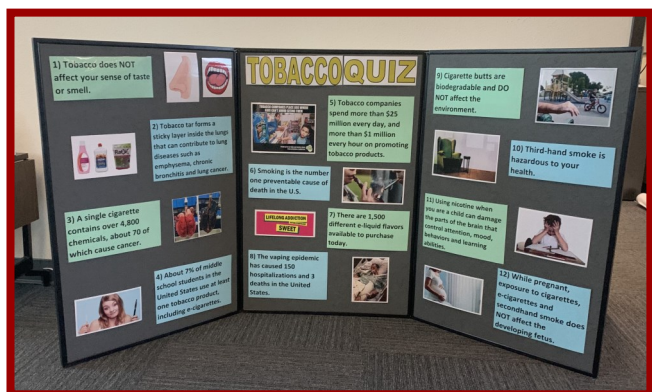
