1. **Call to Order and Attendance:** Chief Probation Officer Thompson called the CCP Meeting to order at 9:05 a.m., with quorum of members present.
2. **Approval of Minutes:** There were no prior minutes to be reviewed.

4. **Information/Discussion/Action Items:**

Item a: **Review/approve 2018-2019 Revised Implementation Plan (Discussion/Action):**
Chief Thompson asked if anyone had any changes to the plan. None were suggested, discussion was held as to the overall content of the plan. Cindia Martinez made a motion to approve, seconded by Sheriff Warren. Motion passed unanimously.

Item b: **2019/2020 Budget (Discussion):**
Chief Thompson requested that for the next meeting that participating agencies submit the budget requests for the next fiscal year by the next meeting. Chief Thompson stated that if the County continues to use AB109 reserve funds to replace probation's generally funded budget that reductions to core programs/staffing would have to be made by the end of the 2020/2021 fiscal cycle.

Cindia Martinez asked if other counties were experiencing the same budget issues that Glenn County is, specifically if counties are replacing probation general funds with AB109, and if so did the Chief Probation Officers of California have an opinion on it. Chief Thompson responded that Glenn County's situation is unique in how those funds are being used to replace the probation budget. Chief Thompson stated he would continue to advise the Board and Finance Committee of the consequences of continuing to use AB109 reserves in that it will lead to reductions to core AB109 of services, and potentially trigger layoffs in probation department if general funds are not fully restored by the end of the 2020/2021 fiscal year.
