1. Call to Order and Attendance: Chief Probation Officer Brandon Thompson called the Emergency CCP Meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. Full quorum present.

2. Public Comment

3. Information/Discussion/Action Items:

Matter a: Heard presentation by the District Attorney for additional request for funding for 2017/2018 fiscal year.

Documents: None

Proceedings: District Attorney, Dwayne Stewart, requested additional funding of up to \$100,000, for the remaining of the 2017-2018 fiscal year, so that he would be able to continue to fund his deputy district attorneys that work on AB109 case load.

Amy Lindsey offered to give up her funding that was previously approved by the CCP Committee to fund her clinician, to help the District Attorney fund his deputy district attorneys, as she had not yet filled the position and didn't anticipate doing so by the end of this fiscal year.

It was recommended that instead of redirecting HHS funds approved for their clinician to the District Attorney budget, that the \$100,000 being requested come from the funds available from the previous year unspent realignments funds.

Amy Lindsey made a motion to approve up to an additional \$100,000 to the District Attorney's office for this fiscal year, to fund the deputy district attorneys, and to have the chair of the CCP Committee write a letter to the Board of Supervisors informing them of the additional funding being provided to the District Attorney's Office.

Before adjourning the meeting, Sheriff Warren wanted to acknowledge that even though at this time we were doing some cleaning up this year, that CCP monies have a huge impact on the District Attorney's Office and it's only appropriate that we allow

the District Attorney's Office to continue to operate with the impact that they have from AB109 Realignment, and that we come up with a way in next year's budget to continue to fund the positions. Chief Probation Officer, Brandon Thompson agreed.
