This would be to fund Colusa LIHWAP residents. Funds are to be expiring in March. If we don't use them, we give them back. This funding can only go to municipalities. This is only for outstanding water bills. J. Bell reported that the city of Williams has started putting liens on people who have not paid their bills. DOE funds are weatherization funds – still have funds because of the lack of trainings.

Glenn LICN the highest request is transportation, primarily for out of county providers In Colusa, CHA is underway. Focus groups are underway. Forces of change meeting coming up at the end of October. Crossover for ECM in Colusa and Glenn Counties.

Colusa County – Merced Corona BOS are busy right now going thru negotiations and bargaining times. Budget time so hopefully approval of budget occurs at next week. J. Bell flu clinic next week through the health department. J. McMullan senior food funding, went to a food summit recently, poverty and food insecurity is more directed at the elderly now since it has changed from children to seniors. B. Wathen: Regional housing started moving dirt (construction). MACC is a lose confederacy of ministers that get together and they meet monthly. Colusa county does a Christmas food basket, and last year they served over 1,000 families.	
	<ul> <li>B. Glenn County –</li> <li>Phil Zabell is continuing to bring in a general mobile series to the western part of the county, which is the most susceptible to wild fires for when the towers don't work. J. McMullan opening a new office by next week - Glenn County in flagship office where MACC's leadership will be stationed. Staff currently stationed at First Care will be moving to the new office. An MOU was just signed with True North Housing Alliance, they are in Chico (Butte County). The MOU allows for beds to be used for Glenn County residents. They also have a transport vehicle, which will help in this matter Debbie Moutter: the community dinner is still occurring once a month. 30+ people attended last month. The Moose Lodge will have a first responders' dinner on 10.21.2023. There are 19 agencies that have been invited (75 individuals invited). J. Kelly: brought up Christmas and Adopt a Family/Adopt an Elder which is set to start back up at this time of the year. Programs continues to grow. This has been going on for about 11 years now. Public assistance medi-cal needs to be encouraged to our elder population. Asset limits will no longer be accounted for elderly's Medi-Cal approval starting 1/2024. Citizenship for Medi-Cal approval will be eliminated effective 1/2024 in California only.</li> <li>Brenda Enriquez: SDoH is around social connectiveness, surgeon general released an article "Our Epidemic of Loneliness and Isolation". This is an emerging issue that we are focusing on, specifically our SDoH grant.</li> <li>Jason Ross: foodbank is going great and increasing value. They will be getting forklifts and refrigeration boxes hopefully by next month. They support Colusa, Glenn and Tehama. They are the only foodbank in these counties. They stop at the Men's house and STAR center to stock their pantries.</li> <li>Bill Wathen: next food giveaway is set for the 21<sup>st</sup>. Flu clinic 9/30 at the fairgrounds. They did a car seat check yesterday.</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>C. Trinity County – Sheri White reported that a lot of business and/or housing are being dropped by insurance companies. HRN was dropped by their current insurance company. It is going to cost the agency over \$50,000 to be where they need to be and meet the insurances requirements. They want to know if there is assistance to assist homeowners. Housing requests are going up right now. Next month is DV awareness month and men and women who are in these situations usually end up homeless. Currently working with Sacramento to house someone who is victim of human trafficking. HRN will be doing a candle light walk to honor survivors.</li> <li>D. Other Universal Concerns Phil Zabell, authentic German meal will be served at this year's Oktoberfest. Should you want to attend, please contact Phil as he is selling for 10/1/2023. Fatalities in Lahaina went from 115 to 97 through DNA.</li> </ul>
