

Glenn County Multi-Casualty Incident Exercise

This was the scene of the 2015 Glenn County full-scale disaster exercise on July 11th, where over one hundred people gathered to participate in this community preparedness event. Responders from twelve agencies worked collaboratively to sharpen their skills and gain valuable training and experience for response to a multiple casualty incident.

This exercise was planned and designed by Glenn County Public Health – Emergency Preparedness Program, City of Willows Fire Department, Glenn Medical Center, and Absolute Safety Training. This exercise was designed as a hands-on training opportunity for paramedic students in the Absolute Safety Training program. Additionally, this exercise grew to provide an opportunity for local responders to come together and build lasting relationships that will aid our community.
