- Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) has been approved for the year. Projects include: the purchase of tables and chairs for the alternate EOC at the GCSO conference room, and GIS equipment for the planning department which will be used to assist with mapping evacuation zones throughout the operational area.
- Both Fiscal Year 2020 and 2021 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) have been approved.
- o Fiscal Year 2022 HSGP is under review.
- FY 2019 is winding down, final purchases include repeaters for patrol cars, radios for fire departments, and tablet laptops for WFD.
- o The EOC generator has been ordered but is delayed. The RFP for installation is in process.
- Under the State Public Safety Power Shutoff Grant (PSPS) a solar powered generator was purchased for Elk Creek Schools.T he generator has arrived and can be used charge devices and run the newly purchased portable A/C units during a PSPS event.
- Drought Taskforce meetings will resume 3/17/22 at 1500 hours, GCOE Conference Room in Orland.
- o OA Communications meeting will be held on April 13th at 1600, HHSA EOC Conference Room.
