8. **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**
 - a. River Access Report – Steve Martignoni gave a short report. He reported that Irvine Finch is open, Butte City is open and Ord Bend is open with advisements. A short discussion was had between Commissioners & Steve Martignoni.
 - b. Monthly Fish & Game Financial Report – Chair Hansen presented the report at \$27,383.21.
 - c. Routine maintenance agreement – Chair Hansen gave update. Karen Mantele has completed her portion and the project is now in the hands of the Glenn County Public Works.
 - d. Shooting Range update/NRA Range group information – Bob Faust gave a short recap and update on his progress. He came up with a possible name for the facility as the “Westside Shooting & Education Facility”. He is moving forward with the process by looking for funding and creating a conceptual plan for the site. The initial step is to get the Glenn County Board of Supervisors to approve the name in order to move forward.
 - e. Plaskett Dredging update – Commissioner Hays spoke with USFS biologist Monique Sanchez who stated they have the funding for the cleaning out of the weeds with the work to be done by the Alder Springs conservation camp inmates probably sometime after Labor Day.

f. Plaskett Fish Plant for July 4th & Labor Day – Chair Hansen spoke with the state hatchery and verified last week that the trout have survived and the plants will be proceeding as planned.

9. NEW BUSINESS:

a. Hunter Safety Class - The early class was held in March. Commissioner Hays stated that registration is available online. The next class will be June 12, 13, 14, 2017. Commissioner Hays stated they are also looking for instructors. Mike D'Errico offered help from the refuge staff.

10. AGENCY REPORTS: Craig Isola with the US Fish & Wildlife gave a short report regarding the hunting program at the Sacramento Valley Refuge. They will be doing a disabled veterans hunt at the Colusa Refuge.

Steve Martignoni with California Fish & Wildlife stated there will be a new field lieutenant for this area, Barry Ceccon. He gave a short report on the different law enforcement departments/agencies within the California Fish & Game and what they are working on. He also gave a report on the local lakes and the deer take in the B3 zone.
