ABOUT CLOTH FACE COVERINGS



To reduce the spread of COVID-19, CDC recommends that people wear cloth face coverings in public settings when around people outside of their household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

WHO SHOULD WEAR A FACE COVERING?

- Anyone sharing a public place with others
- Workers in customer facing industries
- Workers in offices, factories, or any group setting
- Other workers as dictated by industry guidance

WHO SHOULD NOT WEAR A FACE COVERING?

- Children under age 2
- Anyone with respiratory issues where it would impede their breathing
- Anyone unable to remove the mask without help
- Persons with a medical or mental health condition or disability that prevents them from wearing a face covering
- Workers who are required to wear PPE-surgical masks or N95 respirator

WHEN SHOULD YOU WEAR ONE?

- In any indoor public space
- When waiting in line
- When getting healthcare
- On public transportation or ride-sharing
- When outdoors, if you cannot stay 6 feet away from others
- At work, when sharing common spaces or enclosed areas

WHEN CAN YOU REMOVE YOUR FACE COVERING?

- When eating or drinking
- when communicating with the hearing impaired
- If wearing a face covering imposes a risk to you at work
- When you are not sharing a common area, room, or enclosed space with others
- At work, if your desk or work station is not accessible to the public and you can maintain 6 feet of distance from others at all times
- When you are getting personal service to the nose or face
- When outdoors in public and are able to stay 6 feet away from others who are not members of your household
