## PREFACE

This Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP) was developed in 2021, expanding the former Training and Exercise Plan (TEP) to a holistic preparedness document. This IPP was developed by the Glenn County Office of Emergency Services for the Glenn County Operational Area. The IPP serves as a planning document and prioritizes planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise capabilities for response agencies.

This IPP covers a five-year period beginning in 2019 through 2024. This five-year period was selected to ensure consistency with the current five-year period established for the Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) grant program.

The IPP is the primary responsibility of Glenn County Sheriff's Office – OES and is developed in coordination with Glenn County Health and Human Services Agency – Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program. This document is updated annually.

## PURPOSE

The purpose of Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP) is to provide an analysis of issues, trends, and key outcomes of preparedness priorities such as those covered in a multi-year schedule of preparedness activities. The program report is designed to:

- Inform senior leaders on the progress of preparedness priorities.
- Provide data to support preparedness assessments and reporting requirements, and
- Enable exercise planners to modify objectives and the preparedness activity schedule to reflect knowledge gathered from the exercises process, so organizations can address known shortfalls prior to exercising capabilities.

The Multi-year IPP should lay out a combination of progressively building exercises – along with the associated training requirements – which address the priorities identified in the Integrated Preparedness Workshop (IPPW). A progressive, multi-year exercise program enables organizations to participate in a series of increasingly complex exercises, with each successive exercise building upon the previous one until mastery is achieved. Further, by including training requirements in the planning process, organizations can address known shortfalls prior to exercising capabilities.

A Multi-year IPP may also serve as a follow-on companion document to the Glenn County Office of Emergency Services and Public Health Preparedness and Health Care Coalition Preparedness plan (work plan documents and other preparedness tools) and can provide a roadmap for Glenn County to follow in accomplishing the priorities described therein.

Included in this Multi-year IPP is a training and exercise schedule, which provides a graphic illustration of the proposed activities scheduled for the years 2019 through 2024.

*Update August 27, 2021*

*Adjustments to the schedule of exercises due to COVID-19 response and restrictions. Restrictions for limited in-person training and exercises has resulted in the cancellation and delay of a numerous events. Adjustments have been made to the schedule through 2024.*

## Threats, Hazards, Risks

As identified in the 2019 OA EOP, Glenn County is vulnerable to the following hazards:

- Hazardous materials incident/release (both fixed facility and transportation)
- Flood
- Severe weather (heat, storms, etc.)
- Levee Failure
- Transportation Mass Casualty Incident
- Utility Disruptions (communications, power, water, sewage)
- Wildfires
- Disease Outbreak/Epidemic/Pandemic
- Dam Failure
- Landslide/mudslide
- Seismic events – Earthquake/Volcano
- Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, Explosive (CBRNE) events
- Terrorism, Bioterrorism, Agroterrorism
- Social unrest

*Cybersecurity vulnerability was added through a review and update of the Hazard Vulnerability Assessment in August 2022.*

## Preparedness Priorities

Based on the above-mentioned considerations, it was determined the following priorities will be the focus for the multi-year cycle of preparedness:

Preparedness Priorities
<b>1. Emergency Operations &amp; Communications – Train and equip for all-hazards emergency operations coordination and communications.</b>
<b>2. Evacuation Operations – Improve the efficiency of evacuations.</b>
<b>3. Mass Care &amp; Shelter Operations – Increase the ability to manage human and animal sheltering operations</b>
<b>4. Public Health &amp; Medical Surge and specialty care – Develop plans to address gaps in surge and specialty care related to infectious disease, chemical, and burn incidents.</b>
<b>5. Mass Casualty Incidents – Increase the ability to respond to multi casualty and mass casualty incidents.</b>
<b>6. Cybersecurity – Enhance security of information technology systems.</b>

## Priority 1

### Emergency Operations & Communication

#### *Corresponding Core Capabilities:*

- Operational Coordination
- Operational Communications
- Public Information & Warning

#### *Rationale:*

Emergency operations communication are critical to every response, all hazards. Without the appropriate infrastructure in place communications and coordination may fail.

- Acquire warehouse site for OES and law operations.
- Secure OES and law sites including warehouse and PSAP.
- Sustain agreement with FEMA for access to the Integrated Alert and Warning System (IPAWS).
- Maintain and expand redundant communications including HF radios, satellite communications, and radio communications.

## Priority 2

### Evacuation Operations

#### *Corresponding Core Capabilities:*

- Operational Coordination
- Operational Communications
- Public Information & Warning
- Mass Search & Rescue Operations

#### *Rationale:*

Evacuation is likely response action in response to hazards such as flood, dam/levee failure, and wildfire, all of which rank in our top 10 hazards.

The need for evacuations resulted from the following incidents:

- 2018 Chrome Fire
- 2018 Mendocino Complex Fire
- 2020 August Complex Fire
- 2022 Edward Fire

To improve efficiency of future evacuations the following areas were identified for improvement.

#### *Planning Factors:*

- The Glenn County Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan was approved and implemented in September 2019. This Plan includes an Annex for Evacuation. Review and revision 2024
- Development of evacuation zones and mapping would expedite and clarify evacuation orders and notifications. Update Evacuation Plan Annex following completion of this project.
- Establish an Ag Pass Program consistent with surrounding counties within the region. This program will expedite and verify residential access to properties under evacuation orders, permitting access to evacuate or care for livestock.

- Establish evacuation zone map layers in GIS platform and input in CodeRED alert system.
- Purchase GIS equipment.
- Develop GIS application for road closures and damage tracking.

- Edward Fire 2022 – real incident
- Mass care and shelter activation and operations is relevant to the response to hazards such as flood, dam/levee failure, wildfire, and mass evacuation from a neighboring jurisdiction, all of which rank in our top 10 hazards.

#### *Planning Factors:*

- The Glenn County Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan was approved and implemented in September 2019. This Plan includes an Annex for Care and Shelter. Review and revise in 2024 with EOP update.
- The Shelter Field Operations Guide was developed and implemented in 2019 resulting from the Campfire incident after action report. Review and revise in 2023.

- Purchase and equip sheltering trailers, located in north and south county staging areas.
- Purchase necessary equipment for animal sheltering as identified during the Campfire and the August Complex incident AARs.

- Medical surge and specialty care operations is relevant to the response to hazardous materials release, chemical biological radiological nuclear and explosive (CBRNE) incidents and communicable disease and pandemics, all of which rank in our top 10 hazards.

- Cyber vulnerabilities exist in operating infrastructure.
- Cyber-attacks have significantly increased and organizations within Glenn County have been impacted by cyber-attacks in 2022 resulting in significant disruption of services.
