#### THE SELECTION PROCESS

Candidates must submit a completed job application, resume and cover letter. Application packets will be screened and candidates considered best qualified will move forward to a competitive examination process, which may include a written exam, practical skills exam, an oral interview, fingerprinting/background check or medical examination process if applicable. Eligible lists are used for Full-Time (40 hrs./wk. with benefits), Part-Time (20-39 hrs./wk. with benefits), and Public Service employee (PSE) temporary (limited benefits).

#### THE POSITION

This position under general supervision, provides crisis intervention and advocacy services to victims and witnesses of crimes; assists in authorizing a variety of services and obtaining reimbursement for financial losses resulting from a crime; provides information to victims of a crime about the criminal justice system; and performs related work as assigned. This position is scheduled for forty (40) hours per week.

#### THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will be able to act quickly and calmly in crisis and/or emergency situations. This person will be able to maintain confidentiality while they establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the performance of required duties.

#### WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Reviews, evaluates, and verifies all financial losses and alternative reimbursement sources in order to determine the amount of benefit the victim or witness is entitled to receive in accordance with established criteria under the California State Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board.
- Counsel crime victims and refer them to appropriate agencies; advise victims
  of crime of their rights and benefits under local, State, and/or Federal agencies (i.e. State Board of Control). Assists victims in completing claim forms
  for victim services and benefits.
- Provide crisis intervention and emergency assistance.
- Conduct follow-up counseling with victims to ensure their needs have been met.
- Screens application forms for victims and witnesses of cases referred by Victim/Witness.
- Prepare, counsel, and encourage victims to testify and accompany them to court, giving special attention to children and elderly victims and witnesses.
- Prepare correspondence, assessment reports, victim fact sheets, docket sheets, program information, and related reports.
- Promote, attend, and initiate awareness of Victim Witness Programs at community events.

Equivalent to an Associate's degree with major course work in criminal justice, sociology, psychology, or a closely related field. **OR** Completion of 30 units of college with major course work in criminal justice, social work, sociology, psychology, or a closely related field and two (2) years of full-time experience providing case management, interviewing and advising clients of available programs, services, and resources in a public or private social service, health care, or criminal justice agency. **OR** Three (3) years, full-time experience in a Victim Witness Program engaged in clerical and public contact duties related to interviewing clients for program eligibility and assistance with case management duties such as claims processing and verification of service authorizations.
